Your affiant has been a police officer with the Alexandria Police Department for the past 19 years and has been assigned to the patrol division for the past 2 years. Your affiant has obtained over 50 drug related search warrants while assigned to the Narcotics Division in 10 years. Your affiant observed the weapons inside 4600 Duke Street, Apartment #1625, Alexandria, VA while assisting on the arrest of the suspect.

**In support of a search warrant for a residence:**

**4600 DUKE STREET APARTMENT 1625**

**ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA**

On July 7, 2000, Ms. Karen Campbell responded to the headquarters building of the Alexandria Police department to file a report of ~~burglary~~, abduction, assault and destruction of private property. She met with Officer Janice McCredy, patrol officer assigned to the Field Operations Bureau, Patrol Division 2. Ms. Campbell advised Officer McCredy that both she and her 17 yr old daughter had been held against their will by a known person identified as William Kinjo Smith, an Asian/American male, with whom she had had a prior relationship. She further advised Officer McCredy that Smith also resides in the same apartment building as she, 4600 Duke Street, Alexandria, Virginia. Campbell resides in apartment #1024 and Smith resides in apartment #1625. Campbell advised that as he was exiting her apartment, she found Smith outside the door apparently waiting for her to exit. At that point, Smith entered the opened door and forced her back inside of the apartment. Smith was displaying a "fatigue green" colored cylindrical tube with a yellow stripe around same. Smith had his index finger on what she took for a release pin. Campbell attempted to reach a phone to summons police assistance, but Smith at that point pulled the phone from the wall rendering same inoperable. Campbell's 17 yr old daughter was in a bedroom sleeping and Ms. Campbell attempted to alert her to tell her to flee the location. Campbell attempts to phone for police assistance from that bedroom phone and Smith destroys that phone also. As Smith is bending over to disable the phone, Campbell notices a bulge under Smith's shirt which she recognizes to be a concealed pistol, believed to a .45 caliber semi-auto pistol which does in fact belongs to Campbell, but was left in Smith's control and custody sometime in the past six months. Campbell said that she tried to get the pistol from Smith as he bent over to disable the phone, but he turned away from her reach. She was, however, able to touch the concealed weapon through the fabric of the shirt and was able to recognize the feel of the pistol under the shirt.

Smith then blockaded the bedroom doorway telling Campbell that they "needed to talk." After some 20 minutes of arguing between the two parties, the whole time with Smith blocking the egress of Campbell and her daughter from the bedroom, Smith turned and left the apartment thus allowing Ms. Campbell to respond to police headquarters to report this offense. A report was taken by Officer McCredy who in turn appeared before Magistrate Williard, who upon hearing the facts of the case, issued a warrant charging Smith with Burglary under Ti 18.2-91 , two counts of abduction under Ti. 18.2-47 and Destruction of

Property un Ti 18.2-137.

In the mean time, your affiant was assigned to circulate the 10<sup>th</sup> floor level of the 4600 Duke Street building as the suspect, Smith, was reported to be walking around in the building. Unable to locate the suspect, your affiant learned that Smith lived on the 16<sup>th</sup> floor of the building in apartment 1625. Your affiant positioned himself outside the front door of apartment 1625 and heard the phone ring within the residence when called by other police officials. The suspect was ultimately persuaded to surrender to police who were positioned outside of his apartment door. The suspect, Smith, opened his door and handed your affiant what appeared to be a military style hand grenade. Smith then allowed your affiant access into apartment 1625 where I observed several automatic weapons to include pistols and a sub-machine gun type weapon. Your affiant observed numerous filled ammunition magazines to include "clips" that were taped together that appeared to fit the weapons. The weapons were on display in the bedroom of apartment 1625 and appeared to be loaded and in the "cocked" position. I had observed large containers of kerosene at the front door as well as two (2) 50 gallon drums of water at the front door of the apartment securing same. A cursory check of the apartment was made as the suspect was taken into custody. Your affiant had been advised that warrants for the suspect were forthcoming for the suspect, William Kinjo Smith. Your affiant was further advised that Smith was a convicted felon. With this verified information, your affiant believes that the seizure of any and all mentioned firearms and munitions observed in the apartment will constitute further evidence of a felony, to wit: Possession of Firearm by Convicted Felon under Va code 18.2-308.2


